Group C:


grinning, printed, thinking, inches, windy, glitter, knitted, quitting, digit, limited

Sight Words: have, out, each, word **Sentence:** Each twin knitted the word glitter.

Group D:

interesting, quilt, inventor, filtered, internet, scissors, splintered, inference, investigator, knitting

<u>Sight Words</u>: ourselves, several, problem, raise <u>Sentence</u>: The inventor found an interesting quilt on the internet.



Ask Your Child About:

1) Symbols that represent Canada. Including representations on our coins, our national colours, sports, tree and animal!



2) Three different types of punctuation used to end a sentence. We have gone over when to use a period and exclamation mark, and the 5 "W" words that tell us when we need to use a question mark.
