# Zones of Regulation

We have been implementing the Zones of Regulation program at NCS. Here are some more definitions of the language we have been using:

Comfortable feelings vs. uncomfortable feelings.
Comfortable feelings are those we get when we display expected behaviour. For example, we may be comfortable being happy, calm and "ready to go" in the green zone, but we might be uncomfortable feeling nervous, scared or worried in the yellow zone. Behaviours that may cause uncomfortable feelings would be unexpected.
